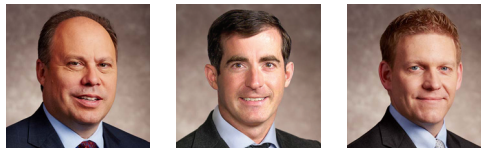

Portfolio Construction

- Typically 40-60 holdings
- Maximum position size generally 5%¹
- Position sizes determined in part by how well a company meets the team's margin of safety criteria
- Attention to economic exposure
- Market capitalization range generally within that of the Russell Midcap® Index²
- Typically less than 10% cash

Russell Midcap® Value Index measures the performance of US mid-cap companies with lower price/book ratios and forecasted growth values. Russell Midcap® Index measures the performance of roughly 800 US mid-cap companies. 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Median is the data's midpoint value. **Market Cap** is the aggregate value of all of a company's outstanding equity securities. **Weighted Average** is the average of values weighted to the data set's composition. **Weighted Harmonic Average** is a calculation of weighted average commonly used for rates or ratios. **Price-to-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio)** measures how expensive a stock is. Earnings figures used for FY1 and FY2 are estimates for the current and next unreported fiscal years. **Price-to-Book Ratio (P/B Ratio)** measures a company's stock price in relation to its book value (the total amount a company would be worth if it liquidated its assets and paid back all its liabilities). **Fixed Charge Coverage Ratio** indicates a firm's ability to satisfy fixed financing expenses, such as interest and leases. **Active Share** is defined as the percentage of a portfolio that differs from its benchmark index. Active Share can range from 0% for an index fund that perfectly mirrors its benchmark to 100% for a portfolio with no overlap with an index. **Portfolio Turnover** is a measure of the trading activity in an investment portfolio—how often securities are bought and sold by a portfolio. **Free Cash Flow** is a measure of financial performance calculated as operating cash flow minus capital expenditures. **Return on Capital (ROC)** is a measure of how effectively a company uses the money (borrowed or owned) invested in its operations.

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
