Commentary

The MSCI AC World Index increased 2.1% in local currency but only 0.8% in dollars as most foreign currencies declined against the greenback. Developed markets led the advance, with the G7 Index up 3.0% in local currency and 2.0% in USD. Currency was a significant factor in developed Asia—Pacific markets increased 4.5% in local terms but declined 1.6% in USD. Emerging markets sold off—down 2.2% in local currency and 4.6% in USD. During November, the yen weakened substantially against the dollar along with significant weakness in the euro. Pound sterling strengthened against the dollar, regaining a small part of the losses it suffered in the prior month.

The top contributors to performance in November were Citigroup, Citizens Financial Group and BNY Mellon. Financial stocks have generally performed well due to the expectation of rising rates and easing regulation.

Key detractors from performance included Medtronic, ISS and Telefonica Brasil. Medtronic reported quarterly results in November showing organic growth up low single digits against the company's objective of mid-single-digit revenue growth, disappointing investors. The company is expecting growth to pick up in the second half of its fiscal year, bringing it closer to full-year targets. ISS reported results at the beginning of the month—growth has remained at a steady level year to date. However, the company moderately narrowed its organic growth guidance for the full year, implying a weak fourth quarter partially because of a delayed contract signing. Telefonica Brasil reported excellent results going into the month but gave back some of its strong year-to-date performance due to a selloff in emerging markets equities.
